At each level documentation must be available as to what students know and are able to do at the completion of their years spent in higher education. Assessing Student Learning Outcomes Guide Program-based Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) articulate the knowledge, behaviors, skills, attitudes, or values students should be able to demonstrate as a result of having participated in the program. knowledge, skills and abilities individual students should possess and can demonstrate upon completion of a learning experience or sequence of learning experiences. Before preparing a list of learning outcomes consider the following recommendations: Learning outcomes should be specific and well defined. What Are Student Learning Outcomes? Developing learning outcomes means that the context of the learning will always be emphasized, and courses focus on the knowledge and skills that will be most valuable to the student now and in the future. Learning outcomes point to useful methods of assessment. What Are Learning Outcomes? – Centre for Teaching Support ... Clearly stating measurable outcomes and communicating the key outcomes in which students are expected to demonstrate proficiency, by the end of a course or the completion of a program, facilitates the successful achievement of these outcomes by students. Valid assessments use measures (assignments) that are aligned with the student learning outcomes and this enables faculty and departments to determine whether or not each student in the sample has achieved the expected level of proficiency. Assessment Guide Introduction In contrast to Goals, that are general, broad, often abstract statements of desired results, Outcomes are specific and measurable and must reflect the curriculum. They express a benefit or "value added" that a student can demonstrate upon completion of an academic program or course. learning into three areas (cognitive, affective, and behavioral). Levels of performance required by the student for each domain are then defined and assessed through the use of rubrics. Student Learning Outcomes Student Learning Outcomes are statements that specify what students will know, be able to do or be able to demonstrate when they have completed or participated in a Course or Program.
